


The Federation will supply dinner on Saturday night. On the menu will be Pulled Pork and Beans. Tribes, please feel free to bring appetizers and deserts. Don't forget your bathing suit! We will not reserve canoes but if you want one, they will be available for members to rent.

Each family will need to sign a waiver before entering the park. Fill them out beforehand to avoid the line.

Longhouse Registration is \$30 per person for the entire weekend, and must be PAID IN ADVANCE ONLINE VIA CIRCLEBRIDGE. All participants must have paid the Local Federation Dues and National Longhouse Dues. All children must be accompanied by a legal guardian. (Go to www.timucuan.org)

Dinner on Saturday: Pulled Pork and Beans for all tribes. Tribes, feel free to bring appetizers and deserts.

Sacred Fire & Respect for the Great Spirit: Each tribe should deliver at least 4 nice logs to the Opening Ceremony for the Sacred Fire). During the Sacred Fire, as well as the Opening & Closing ceremony, everyone should remember to wear their vests and be respectful when someone has the Talking Stick. During the Firewalk all Big Braves and Guides are to observe silence and reflect on their time as father and son. Please, no flashlights, only torches

Reminders:

- ~ Dress in layers – temps can fluctuate this time of year.
- ~ Bring your vests and your new Native Sons and Daughters headbands.
- ~ Don't forget your Tiki Torches for the Sacred Fire Walk.
- ~ If you want electric power for your campsite, bring an RV plug converter.
- ~ Put your campfires out completely – cold to the touch – 18 inches deep.
- ~ Leave your campsite better than you found it. Reinforce respect for forest, field and stream with your Braves.
